

In-Depth Republic Services® Recycling Program Information

The Republic Services recycling program is very comprehensive. Here is a list of acceptable items that can be mixed in one cart:

- Newspaper (including inserts)
- Corrugated cardboard
- Office paper
- Mixed paper
- Chipboard (cereal and tissue boxes)
- Brown paper bags
- Phone books
- Plastic (#1 - #7), plastic bottles and tubs
- Aluminum (do not crush)
- Steel or tin cans
- Empty aerosol cans
- Glass bottles and jars
- Aluminum foil
- Magazines
- Detergent bottles
- Plastic milk jugs
- Bulk or junk mail
- Metal jar lids (pickles, etc.)

To prepare your items to be recycled, please make sure all recyclables are empty, clean and dry. Please discard lids, caps and pumps on bottles, and make sure there are **no plastic bags** mixed in with your recyclables.

- **We do not accept any hazardous or bio-hazardous waste products, such as needles, syringes or used motor oil plastic bottles.**
- **We do not accept used napkins or paper towels.**
- **We do not accept any ceramics, glass kitchenware or windshield glass.**

Here are some more helpful hints when deciding whether you can recycle an item:

- Only recycle plastic bottles and tubs. This is typically plastics #1 - #7 and only pertains to the bottles and tubs. Please do not add clamshell containers or PLA compostable plastics. In addition, try to remove the screw or top cap on a bottle. Here are some examples of plastic bottles that are OK to recycle:
 - Soda, water and juice bottles
 - Liquid detergent and other cleaning supply bottles
 - Condiment bottles (ketchup, mustard, etc.)
 - Milk jugs and orange juice jugs (paper cartons/containers OK)
 - Shampoo bottles and liquid soap dispensers
 - Peanut butter jars (please rinse out)
 - Butter and yogurt tubs
- Steel - Please make sure any aerosol cans are totally empty. These would include containers such as shaving cream and hairspray cans. Labels are OK.
- Cardboard - Make sure to flatten. No wax-lined cardboard is accepted in the recycling mix. Wax-lined cardboard can be composted in a different service.
- Brown paper bags - **no plastic bags.**
- Chipboard or Paperboard - This type of material includes items such as cereal boxes, soda carrier boxes, tissue holders, paper towel and toilet paper tubes, and other food boxes, such as popcorn or microwave food boxes.

- Paper egg cartons are OK.
- Newspaper - We accept the entire newspaper, including the inserts and ads.
- Office Paper - All types of office paper are accepted. If you can tear it, we can take it. All colors are fine, as well. Don't worry about paper clips, staples, tape and sticky notes. These are all OK in the mix. **No polyethylene fiber plastic or overnight mailing folders. No shredded paper.**
- Bulk or Junk Mail - This material is OK, as well. Do not worry about any stamps, staples or sticky notes. Remember, if you can tear it, we can take it.
- Magazines, Catalogs and Phone Books - Please discard plastic bags around these items and items such as CDs and magnets. Everything else is OK.
- **Plastic items not accepted:**
 - **Plastic bags**
 - Clamshell or "to-go" plastic containers
 - Plastic egg cartons
 - 6-pack ring holders
 - Plastic plates, forks, spoons or knives
 - PLA compostable containers
 - Plastic syringes
 - Polystyrene foam (Styrofoam™)
