





ADDITIONAL ITEMS OF INTEREST

- Edgewater Police Officer William McNamee recently accepted a position with the Thornton Police Department and his last day here in Edgewater was 11/24. Officer McNamee came to us in 2019 from the Logan County Sheriff's Office and prior to that had been a police officer for the City of Sterling. He served on the Jefferson County Regional SWAT team for the last two (2) years and trained several of our younger officers as an F.T.O. We know that we're not always the final destination for everyone on their journey so we wish those that move on nothing but success & fulfillment. We have begun the recruiting and application process for Police Officer and look forward to adding someone new to the team soon.
- We have begun the process of applying to participate in the national Active Bystandership for Law Enforcement (A.B.L.E.) project. ABLE aims to create a police culture in which officers routinely intervene as necessary to prevent misconduct, avoid mistakes, and promote officer health and wellness. It is a tedious application process that includes letters of support from community organizations but we are very excited about the program and feel it will take Edgewater P.D. to the next level.
