



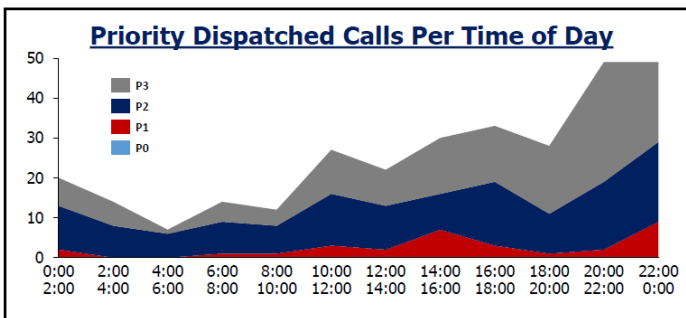

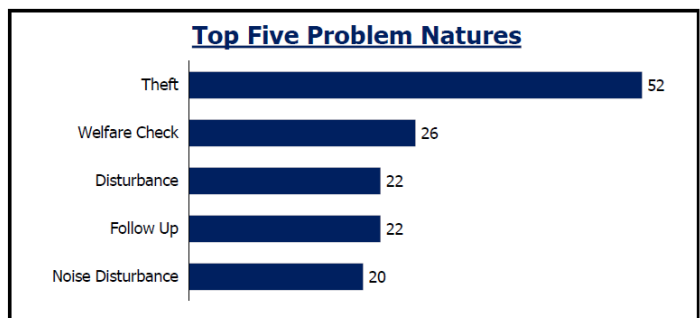
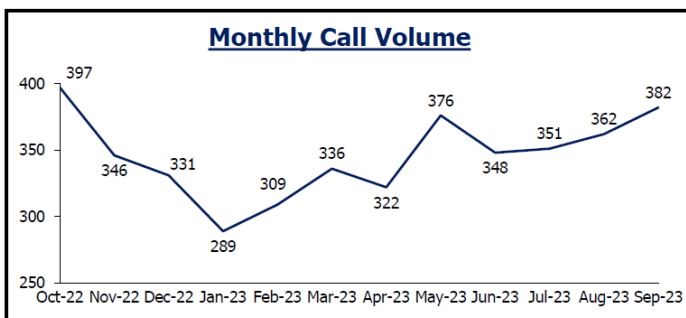

## ADDITIONAL ITEMS OF INTEREST

- We recently agreed to have Dr. Libby Palmer be our official Department Psychologist moving forward. Dr. Palmer is a local psychologist that specializes in providing counseling and training for law enforcement agencies and she spent 15 years as an officer & detective with the Wheat Ridge Police Department before transitioning to being a public safety psychologist. She will lead our efforts in four (4) main areas:
  - Counseling Services-Counseling will be available for employees and their immediate families.
  - Wellness Assessments-She will help with annual wellness checks for all sworn officers.
  - Trainings-We will start with stress management & trauma recovery on our November training days and then offer other topics for 2024.
  - Debriefings/PCIR-She will lead our efforts for debriefings and post-critical incident response.
- In April, we told you the Edgewater Police Department had recently joined the *Safety in Pride* project whose mission is “*To actively engage with communities and local law enforcement partners to build meaningful relationships and increase trust.*” We recently became one of the first two (2) Colorado law enforcement agencies to be a project partner by submitting a memorandum of support and committing to attending in-person training events and encouraging agency staff to participate in online training.
