COE Cost Recovery Model and Strategy

Excerpts taken from the Parks and Recreation Department's Financial Policy Updates presentation to City Council in September 2023, which then revised and adopted the measures in in Q4 2023 for implementation in January 2024.

Purpose

- Create organizational resilience and financial stability.
- Implement revenue generation strategies that are fair, equitable, and responsible.
- Utilize consistent subsidy and cost recovery strategies across City departments.

History

2010: First implemented by Edgewater Parks & Rec Department as Fee Structure Guidelines.

- 2011-21: Used to guide fee structure for programs, rentals and contract instruction parameters
- 2022-Present: Staff education on changes in best practices around pricing, cost recovery and subsidy, and revision of Fee Structure Guidelines to encompass all Parks & Rec Financial Policies

Service Category:

Education and Enrichment

Impact

- Keep up with increased costs and demand for services without placing strain on the overall City budget
- Encourages staff to be creative in funding streams
 - Expanding sponsorship opportunities
 - Engaging in partnerships

Needs Based Assistance

- Updates the SMILES program to **CREATE**
- Makes financial assistance available to all Edgewater community members.
- Annual discount based on HUD research, 25-50-75%.
- Can be used for Parks and Recreation, Senior Trips or Sustainability Programs.
